# Medicaid Application Checklist

Applying for [Medicaid](#), or Medical Assistance, for long-term care costs can be daunting. The following checklist provides a list of items you or your loved one will need to complete the Medicaid Application in Pennsylvania.

The [Department of Human Services](#), the agency that administers Medicaid in Pennsylvania, allows applicants to apply via their online [COMPASS](#) system. Applicants can also complete this [application form](#) and mail or bring it to their [local county assistance office](#). In Erie County, the office is at 1316 Holland Street in the City of Erie.

## What information is needed for a Medicaid application?

In order to successfully complete a Medicaid application in Pennsylvania, the following items are needed:

<input type="checkbox"/>	Proof of Identity, Birth Certificate, and Social Security Card
<input type="checkbox"/>	Power of Attorney (if applicable)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Medicare Card / Medical Insurance Card (and proof of current premium)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Spouse Info: Divorce Decree or Death Certificate, if applicable
<input type="checkbox"/>	Social Security/SSI Award Letter for Current Year; Monthly Pension or Retirement Benefit Checks; Info on any other Income
<input type="checkbox"/>	Bank Account Information - All Accounts (statements from past 5 years, and copies of any checks written for over \$500)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Cash on Hand / Stocks / Bonds / Trusts / Annuities / Mutual Funds / Certificates of Deposit
<input type="checkbox"/>	Christmas/Vacation Club
<input type="checkbox"/>	Life Insurance Policies AND 401k/IRA/Deferred Compensation Accounts
<input type="checkbox"/>	Burial Reserve Agreement / Contract
<input type="checkbox"/>	Vehicles AND Real Property Owned by Applicant and/or Spouse (deed for properties owned OR transferred in last 60 months)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Federal and State Tax Forms and All Attachments (from past 5 years)
<input type="checkbox"/>	Information regarding any other GIFTS given in the last 60 months
